DIOCESE OF OLYMPIA COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND CANONS

REPORT TO 2019 ANNUAL DIOCESAN CONVENTION:

At its two meetings this year, our Committee considered clarifications to several canons and provided input to others with respect to resolutions that might involve amendments to the Diocesan Constitution or Canons. The following are changes that the Committee recommends for passage at Convention.

1 First Vote on Changes to Constitution

- 2 Our diocesan Constitution provides (in Article XXI) that it may be amended by a majority
- 3 vote of the two orders voting separately at two successive annual meetings of
- 4 Convention. The following amendments are proposed for their first vote.

5 Constitution Article VIII: (Officers of Convention)

- 6 **Section 2**: Canon 29 has traditionally specified that Diocesan elections take effect
- 7 "upon adjournment" of the Convention meeting where they occur. Section 2 of Article
- 8 VIII provides that the officers of Convention "serve until the following Annual Meeting,"
- 9 leaving some ambiguity as to who serves during the hours of Convention. To clarify this
- point, the Committee suggests the following amendment to Section 2:
- "...the following officers shall be elected to serve until the <u>close of the</u> following
 Annual Meeting:..."
- 13 **Section 3**: The Committee proposes the following clarification of the process by which
- the Diocesan Chancellor is approved by Convention:
- At each Annual Meeting of the Convention the Bishop shall appoint, subject to
- the approval by a simple majority vote of the members of the Convention
- 17 present, a Chancellor of the Diocese who shall be a lay member, an adult
- 18 Communicant in Good Standing of the Church and regularly admitted to practice
- 19 law in the State of Washington.

20 Constitution Article XIV (Nominations and Elections)

- 21 The Committee proposes to clarify that a "written ballot" may be electronic:
- 22 **Section 1:** All elections provided for in this Constitution shall be by written ballot.
- 23 unless consent by unanimous vote of the Convention is given to dispense with
- the requirement. In the event of a failure to elect at any Convention, the person
- or persons already in office shall continue in office until the successor or
- successors shall have been appointed as provided in Article VIII, Section 4. For
- 27 <u>purposes of this section, written ballots may include an electronic ballot.</u>

29 30	Second Vote on Changes to Constitution The following amendment is proposed for its second vote:
31 32	Constitution Article II (Acceding to General Convention National Constitution and Canons)
33 34 35	The Church in the Diocese of Olympia accedes to the Constitution and Canons for government of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America and recognizes the authority of the General Convention of the same.
36 37 38 39 40	Votes on Changes to Canons: Pursuant to Canons 28 and 29, canons can be enacted or amended by a "vote of a majority of each Order". These amendments "take effect upon the adjournment of the meeting of Convention at which they are enacted" unless the Convention votes unanimously for the changes to take immediate effect.
41 42 43 44 45 46 47 48	Canon 16: (Stated Offerings) This Canon requires revision for more than one reason. First, the cross-reference to Title III, Canon 9.5(b)(6) in Section 1 is incorrect; the correct reference would be Canon 9.6(b)(6). Second, the General Convention canons do not require solicitations of funds as indicated in Section 1. Third, the Episcopal Charities Appeal as referenced in Section 3 has been renamed Episcopal Community Action and is not being strictly implemented as indicated in the Canon. The Committee therefore recommends updating the Canon as follows:
49 50 51	The person in charge of a Parish or Mission in this Diocese shall take <u>and allocate</u> the following offerings at the times and for the purposes hereinafter stated:
52 53 54 55	Section 1 Every congregation shall <u>alllocatesolicit</u> offerings for <u>pious and charitable uses</u> the poor to the extent required by the <u>National</u> -Canons of the <u>Episcopal Church</u> - (see, e.g., Title III, Canon 9.5(b)(6) as it may hereafter be amended).
56 57 58	Section 2 Every congregation is encouraged to solicit Cchurch School Lenten Oofferings for special missionary purposes to be designated by the Bishop.
59 60 61 62 63	Section 3 On Thanksgiving Day or the Sunday previous or following, every congregation shall solicit offerings for the Episcopal Charities Appeal or such other charitable purposes as the Convention or Council shallmay determine, with advice from the Bishop.
64	Canon 18 (Pensions):
65 66 67	Each congregation shall be responsible for reporting information and making payments for its clergy to the Church Pension Fund to the extent required by the Canons of the Episcopal Church's National Canons.

69 Canon 27 (Procedural Rules):

Commissions, and committees, and boards established by the Constitution or
Canons of the Diocese may adopt and amend written rules for their own
operation, which rules and amendments shall be submitted to and subject to
approval by the Bishop. The current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly
Revised shall determine questions of procedure not specifically provided for in
the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese.

Canon 28 (Amendment or Repeal):

 These Canons may be <u>enacted</u>, amended or repealed <u>or new ones enacted</u> at any Annual Meeting of Convention by <u>vote of</u> a majority of each Order <u>voting separately</u>. Such changes, <u>new Canons</u>, <u>or the repealing of a Canon now in effect</u> shall first be submitted to the Committee on <u>Constitution & Canons as set forthprovided</u> in Canon 4.

Canon 29 (Date of Taking Effect):

All Canons or amendments hereafter enacted, shall take effect upon the adjournment of the meeting of Convention at which they are enacted, and all elections at Convention shall similarly take effect upon adjournment of the meeting, provided that elections of Convention Secretary and Treasurer under Article VIII of the Constitution shall take effect immediately, and further provided that amendments and/or elections may take effect immediately upon a two thirds vote of each Order, voting separately.

Canon 30 (Communications):

- a. Members of any committee, commission or other Diocesan entity may participate in a meeting by conference telephone or <u>alternative electronic</u> <u>technology similar communications equipment</u> so that all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time. Participation by that method constitutes presence in person at a meeting.
- b. Unless expressly prohibited by applicable Constitutions or Canons or prevailing law, written notices or communications required herein may be provided by electronic mail, facsimile, or other electronic media that generate a contemporaneous record of the transmission and its date and time. Such communications must be capable of being reproduced in a tangible medium by both sender and recipients.
