A Celebration of New and Mutual Ministry

Concerning the Service

This form is appropriate for the welcoming of a new rector or vicar into a congregation. The words 'rector,' 'vestry,' and 'congregation' will be used throughout for the sake of ease. In the first few months of the rector's time in the congregation, the rector and congregational representatives meet and together decide which options to use.

This service is based in a baptismal theology that recognizes and honors the gifts of every person, declaring every gift a vital part of the life of a congregation. With this understanding, the ministry that clergy and congregation share is one where every person brings their unique gifts to share equally - and that sharing of ministry is the celebration that follows here.

Although it may seem a practical consideration to include Confirmation and Reception with this service, the practice is discouraged. Each of these occasions is a time for celebrating our life together as a church. When we combine them, we dilute the celebration inherent in each service. The bishop will find another time for a regularly scheduled visitation (every 3 years) that includes Confirmations and Receptions, or you may join a regional celebration for those rites.

This liturgy specifically discourages the giving of tangible gifts in favor of the naming of specific ministries and spiritual gifts.

The signing of the Letter of Institution is an appropriate occasion for the bishop to sign the Mutual Ministry Agreement worked out between the Rector and Vestry.

Suggested Propers for this service are:

- Proper of the Day
- For All Baptized Christians
- At Baptism
- For the Mission of the Church
- Feast of Title or Patronal Feast

Hymns and anthems should reflect themes of the lessons.

In places where gendered language is used, you may choose to use other choices such as: "One God, Creator of all" OR "God the Mother of all" that are theologically suitable to the liturgical context.

Amen. ¹

The people are seated. The Bishop welcomes the congregation and addresses them regarding the purpose of this gathering.

At the conclusion of the chosen covenant, the Congregation expresses its approval. Applause is appropriate. The Bishop greets the new Rector.

The Peace

The Liturgy of the Table

Any Eucharistic Prayer in the Book of Common Prayer or Enriching Our Worship 1 may be used.

It is right and good, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Holy God, source of all that is. In the midst of our lives you call us to the life-giving truth of eternity in you, that, assembled together we might be a clear reflection of the reconciling love of your son, Jesus Christ, in our church, our communities, and our world. ³

It is right and good, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Holy God, source of all that is. Throughout time you gather your children together, of every age, nation, and ability, to proclaim and witness to the reconciling love of Jesus Christ in our place and time. ⁴

All four orders of ministry should be present at the Table and participate in sharing the Eucharist with the people.

The Induction invites and reveals the whole body of Christ's participation in the mission of the church. As each ministry is named, appropriate members stand and recite their response. They remain standing afterwards. Categories that do not apply can be removed, renamed, or adjusted to match the ministry of the congregation. Where there are many people who will recite a shared response, it is prudent to identify one person beforehand who will lead the response boldly. Ministries may be added, deleted, or changed, as is appropriate to the congregation.


